




Mary Moyer-Rowley

Logan Trumbull is an active, football fanatic fourth grader; his mother never expected him to sit down and write about living through his father's terminal cancer and eventual death in 2007. That story has become a book, "Logan's Story," a lavishly illustrated and interactive tome that helped Logan heal and will help other children better understand grief and loss when someone close to them dies.

"Logan's Story" tells the story of Logan and his older brother Austin, sister Jessica, mother Deanna, dog Daisy, and many friends and family members including Logan's classmates in Mrs. Johnson's third and fourth grade class at Weber Elementary School in Iowa City as they cope with Ray Trumbull's illness and eventually their grief and loss.

The book's illustrations have been lovingly created by Mary Moyer-Rowley, an Iowa City artist and graphic designer who also happens to be Logan's neighbor. As Logan tells his story, Mary has included many interactive pages including word scrambles, dot-to-dot puzzle, and more, to help children more fully engage with the story in a non-threatening way.
